## **ENTRY EXAMINATION**

The entry examination for Master in Translation Studies and non-formal (degree-non-awarding) translation studies consists of three parts:

II.	Essay in the first foreign language	30 points
III.	Tests in the first and second foreign languages:	30 points

A candidate may achieve the maximum score of 100 points at the entry examination.
